# Be Sustainable From Home

## Transform Plastic Waste Into a Bottle Brick

Bottle bricks have been used to build houses, school buildings and other structures for over a decade. This is seen as a viable way to clean up the environment.

To create a plastic brick all you need is a plastic bottle and left over soft plastic. Some good options include plastic bags, plastic wrappers, plastic mesh, twist ties, plastic-coated paper, receipts, cigarette butts, produce stickers and more.

Once you have a bottle stuff it with all the plastic you have collected. From there you can collect them and build an outdoor project. There are many projects you can create such as a bench.
